

The Garden of Eden

"But now they desire a better, that is, a heavenly country. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He has prepared a city for them." Hebrews 11:6. God has promised to restore the world to its origi-

nal beauty and purity. "For the Son of Man is come to seek and to save that which was lost." Luke 19:10. "Then He who sat on the throne said, 'Behold, I make all things new." Revelation 21:5.

No doubt, many wonder what heaven will really be like. I'm sure all of us have seen heaven depicted as a place of clouds with people sitting on the clouds playing a harp throughout all eternity. Fortunately, the Bible gives us an entirely fresh and beautiful picture of the new earth that will be our home. We must always remember, however, "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him." 1 Corinthians 2:9.

The New Jerusalem—A wonderful part of God's kingdom is His capitol city, the New Jerusalem. "And I John saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband." Revelation 21:2. This is the city of God, which all of God's people have looked forward to from the time sin entered the world. Of Abraham the Bible says: "For he waited for the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God." Hebrews 11:10. This New Jerusalem has an apartment in it just for you, for Jesus promised us He would go to His Father's house to prepare a place for us (John 14:1-3).

While John was in exile on the little island of Patmos, off the coast of Turkey, God showed the aged disciple the New Jerusalem in vision. The city has 12 foundations like an ancient ziggurat, and each foundation is made of a



different precious stone (Rev. 21:14, 19). It is laid out as a square with approximately 400 miles per side, or about the size of the state of Oregon (Rev. 21:16). The height of the city is also 400 miles! Obviously the new earth that God will create will accommodate an atmosphere prepared for such a city. There can be no doubt that the city is plenty large enough for everyone who chooses to live there.

"And the construction of its walls was of jasper; and the city was pure gold, like clear glass. . . And the twelve gates were twelve pearls: each individual gate was of

one pearl. And the street of the city was pure gold, like transparent glass." Revelation 21:18, 21. "Before the throne there was a sea of glass, like crystal." Revelation 4:6. The river of life, the tree of life with 12 kinds of fruit, the companionship of God and the angels, and everlasting day are just a few of the wonders of that place (Revelation 22:1-5). If that city were on earth today, people would be packing up and moving to that place. But the good news is that soon that beautiful city will be the capital city of the new earth. God Himself will live with us (Revelation 21:3 & 22:4).

The New Earth—It may come as a surprise, but the Bible teaches that the final home of the redeemed is the earth—an earth made new again. Jesus said the meek would inherit the earth (Matthew 5:5). The apostle Peter wrote that the earth would be cleansed by fire and made new again (2 Peter 3:10-13). And Isaiah also said God would create new heavens and a new earth where God's people will build their own houses and gardens (Isaiah 65:17, 21-22).

Everyone will have perfect bodies and eternal youth. All disabilities will be removed and all diseases healed (Isaiah 35:5-6). We will all eat from the tree of life and drink water from the river of life (Revelation 22:1-



2) . "The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, . . ." ". . . and the leopard shall lie down with the kid, . . . They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain." Isaiah 11:6, 9. "And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying; and there shall be no more pain for the former things have passed away." Revelation 21:4.

For approximately six thousand years this earth has been the one plague spot in the universe. The one world where sin has come. Revelation 7:9-10.
